1. Learners not coming to schools to collect meals.
2. Learners coming to schools in very low numbers.
3. Schools which did not report on feeding or schools which did not open.
4. Schools which initially closed due to COVID 19 did not open during school holidays.

Remedial actions

1. The province encouraged learners and parents to come to schools to collect meals.
2. The province used community radio stations to inform parents and learners to collect meals.
3. Districts and Sub Districts used bulk SMS'es and Whatsapp groups to cascade the message to the learners.
4. The province will continue to use different media platforms to encourage learners and parents to collect meals.
5. Some schools indicated that they used traditional leaders and councillors to cascade the message.
6. Schools have been encouraged to use Menu Calculators to determine quantities and to observe trends in learner attendance to avoid food wastage.

Wayforward

1. Ther learners not yet phased in will continue to collect meals at schools and leave the premises.
2. The province , districts and sub districts will continue to monitor and report on the situation.
3. The province will continue to use different media platforms to encourage learners and parents to collect meals.
4. As a last resort, the province may encourage schools to target learners and only prepare meals for those learners

Some learners coming to schools without wearing the face masks. Not all schools are reporting on feeding of learners. No feeding in some schools due to lack of water. Constant closing of schools due to Covid-19 cases. No Learner Transport to fetch the farm school learners to collect their meals. Learner only show up when their preferred food is being served on that particular day.</p>
<p>Remedial Actions</p> <p>The Communication Office has issued media statements to request communities to encourage learners to come to school to fetch the meals. Schools must ensure that learners keep the social distancing. Parents must ensure that the learners wear their face masks when coming to collect the meals. LTA 15 providing directive to schools on feeding of eligible learners during the break of 27-31 July 2020 was issued to schools. School feeding register and the district reporting template are developed as a mitigation measure and still to be discussed with the districts on Friday, 07 August 2020 Learners should be encouraged to collect their meals daily.</p>
